From Father:

January is a month of fresh beginnings, where many of us set resolutions and chart a course for the year ahead. In the Church, January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus, inviting us to start the year with a renewed devotion to His sacred name.

The Power of His Name

The name of Jesus is not just a word; it is a proclamation of who He is—God saves. As the Angel Gabriel declared to Joseph, "You shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins" (Matthew 1:21). In His name, we find not only salvation but also peace, hope, and strength.

A Name Above All Names

In Philippians 2:9–11, St. Paul writes that God exalted Jesus and gave Him "the name that is above every name." At the name of Jesus, "every knee should bend," a call to humility and reverence. For centuries, Catholics have honored this by bowing their heads at the name of Jesus, a simple yet profound gesture that acknowledges His divine majesty and our dependence on Him. It is a tradition that reflects the reverence due to His holy name and reminds us to carry His presence into our daily lives.

The Devotion to the Holy Name

This devotion began in the early centuries of Christianity and gained particular prominence in the Middle Ages, thanks to the efforts of saints like Bernardine of Siena, who preached the power of Christ's name to bring unity and peace.

Living the Devotion

Devotion to the Holy Name isn't confined to words; it's lived through our actions. When we honor His name, we commit to living in a way that reflects His love and mercy. By bowing our heads when we hear His name, we are reminded to let His presence guide our thoughts, words, and deeds.

May His name be our strength in times of trial, our joy in moments of grace, and our constant reminder of the love God has for us. 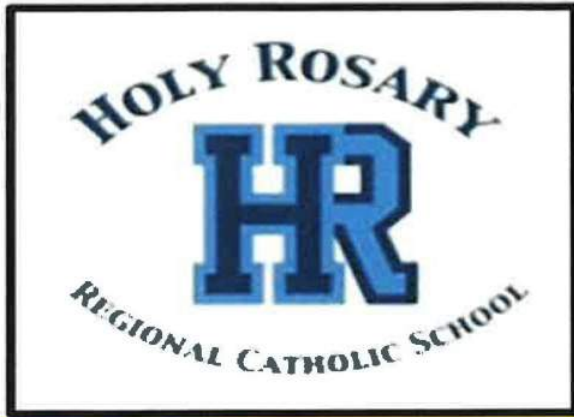

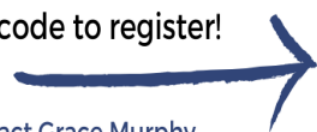



Also, please advise our office staff of any change of address, telephone number or family status.

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is by request. Please notify the Parish Office as soon as possible when any parishioner becomes seriously ill or is admitted to the hospital.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month.

Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

Matrimony

Notify the Parish Office of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana sessions.
