From Father:

This past week, on October 1st, we celebrated the feast day of St. Thérèse of Lisieux, one of the most beloved saints in the Church. Known as "The Little Flower," St. Thérèse has touched countless hearts with her message of humility, trust, and love through her "Little Way." In a world that often values grand gestures and significant accomplishments, Thérèse reminds us that true holiness lies in doing even the smallest of tasks with great love.



The Little Way is a spirituality of simplicity—an invitation to find God in the ordinary moments of life. St. Thérèse taught us that small actions, such as a kind word, a smile to a stranger, or enduring a difficulty with patience, can become powerful acts of love when offered to God. For instance, when we take time to truly listen to someone in need, or when we face an annoyance with a spirit of charity instead of frustration, we are living out Thérèse's Little Way. It's about transforming our daily routines into opportunities for holiness by placing them in God's hands with a heart full of love and trust.

As we continue to draw inspiration from St. Thérèse, I am excited to announce an incredible opportunity for us to walk in her footsteps. In mid-October of next year, we will embark on a pilgrimage to Lisieux and northern France, visiting places such as Paris, Mont St Michel, Rouen, and, of course, Lisieux itself, in celebration of the Holy Year 2025, marking the centenary of her canonization. This pilgrimage will be a wonderful chance to deepen our faith, learn more about St. Thérèse, and experience firsthand the places that shaped her journey of love and trust.

May we all continue to find inspiration in St. Thérèse's Little Way and take this opportunity to grow closer to God through the simple yet powerful acts of love in our everyday lives. The pilgrimage next year promises to be a great blessing, and I hope many of you will consider joining in this exciting journey of faith!

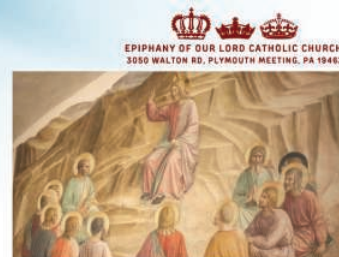

Welcome

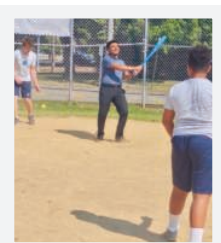
Holy Rosary **welcomed several new teachers** and many new students. Our recent *Back to School Night* was packed with parents/

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is by request. Please notify the Parish Office as soon as possible when any parishioner becomes seriously ill or is admitted to the hospital.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month.

Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

Matrimony

Notify the Parish Office of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana sessions.
