From Father:

Advent is a season of waiting, of lifting our hearts and souls to God with the hope that His presence will transform our lives. From early times, the Church's liturgy has beautifully expressed this longing in the words of Psalm 24: "To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul; O my God, in you I trust." These words capture the boundless anticipation of Israel, but they also invite us into the same spirit of hope and trust today.

Reflecting on this psalm, I was reminded of a powerful insight shared by Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger (later Pope Benedict XVI). He noted how we often neglect the great adventures that lead us into the depths of our own souls. While humanity has mapped the physical world in remarkable detail, our inner selves often remain uncharted territory. Yet, it is within this interior journey that we can encounter the greatest discoveries.

Ratzinger uses Julien Green, a French writer who chronicled his conversion to the Catholic faith, to illustrate this beautifully. In his youth, Green was consumed by worldly pleasures and resisted the call of faith. Yet, despite his resistance, he found himself drawn to churches, quietly hoping for a miracle to liberate him. While no instant miracle occurred, he described sensing a mysterious presence that offered warmth and hope—a presence he would come to recognize as God.

Green's journey was not without struggle. Like many today, he sought liberation through self-reliance or the novelty of exotic spiritualities, but these paths left him unfulfilled. His true awakening came unexpectedly, during a Hebrew lesson with a rabbi. In his study Green felt as though the words of the prophets were calling him home. He realized, "I was Israel, whom God was entreating to come home." He saw himself reflected in the words of Isaiah: "The ox knows its owner, and the donkey its master's crib; but Israel does not know..." (Is 1:3). This profound recognition led him to embrace the faith he had long resisted.

Advent invites us to lift our souls to God, not as a routine or "hackneyed phrase," but as a daring act of trust and hope. It challenges us to recognize the restless longing within us for true freedom, a longing that no modern lifestyle or fleeting pleasure can satisfy. Advent is not about instant miracles or dramatic revelations. Rather, it is about God patiently knocking at the door of our hearts, waiting for us to respond.

In the quiet moments of Advent, we are called to confront the reality that, like Israel, we often fail to recognize our true source of hope and belonging. Yet, when we lower our pride and lift our souls to God, we open ourselves to His transformative presence. This presence does not impose itself but gently penetrates the tangled complexities of our lives, leading us step by step toward true freedom.

As we begin this holy season, let us allow Advent to awaken within us a renewed sense of wonder and anticipation. May we take the risk of stepping forward in faith, trusting in the God who patiently waits for us, whose presence alone can make us free.

Las Posadas



Are you familiar with this Advent devotion that originated in Mexico but is now celebrated in many countries including the USA? Some ministry members from our St Vincent de Paul Society are joyfully doing it together for this first time this year!!!

Las Posadas are traditional devotional celebrations during the 9 days leading up to Christmas. They remind us of the hard journey that Mary & Joseph took and how they sought welcoming shelter; Las Posadas include seeking lodging on that symbolic Nazareth-Bethlehem road. Pope Sixtus V allowed Friar Diego Soria to hold 9 extra masses (symbolic of Mary's 9 pregnancy months) in the days before Christmas to facilitate conversions of the Aztecs.

During the 18th century it became popular for communities to host Las Posadas in their homes.

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month.

Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.
