From Father:

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, the Church invites us to reflect on the reality of eternal life and the preparation of our souls for that journey. One important way we, as Catholics, prepare for this transition is through what is traditionally called the "Last Rites."

What Are the Last Rites?

The term "Last Rites" encompasses several sacramental actions designed to bring spiritual comfort and grace to a person nearing the end of their earthly life. These include:

- **Anointing of the Sick:** This sacrament offers physical and spiritual healing, strength, and courage. It unites the suffering of the sick person with Christ's redemptive suffering.
- **Confession:** The opportunity to reconcile with God through the sacrament of penance, seeking forgiveness for sins.
- **Holy Communion (Viaticum):** The "bread of life" for the journey, offering spiritual nourishment and the presence of Christ as the soul prepares to meet Him.
- **Apostolic Pardon:** A special prayer of absolution granting remission of the temporal punishment due to sin.

The Role of the Anointing of the Sick

The Anointing of the Sick is often misunderstood. While it is sometimes administered in a person's final hours, its purpose is broader. The sacrament is intended to bring healing and peace during serious illness or the natural aging process, and it is most effective when received earlier—weeks or even months before death. We can receive Anointing of the Sick when there is any danger of death either from illness or old age.


When Should You Call?

As the only priest in residence here at Epiphany of Our Lord, I encourage families to call the rectory sooner rather than later if a loved one is seriously ill or facing declining health. This ensures I can come in time to administer these sacred sacraments and pray with the individual and their family. Waiting until the last moments may mean missing the opportunity to provide the full measure of grace and comfort these rites offer.

Sacramental Presence

The Last Rites remind us that, in life's most vulnerable moments, Christ's presence is real and tangible through the sacraments. These prayers and sacraments provide profound peace and hope for the journey ahead. Let us all keep this ministry of mercy in mind for ourselves and our loved ones



Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is by request. Please notify the Parish Office as soon as possible when any parishioner becomes seriously ill or is admitted to the hospital.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month.

Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office, Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

Matrimony

Notify the Parish Office of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana sessions.
