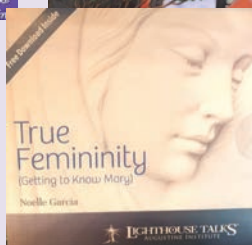
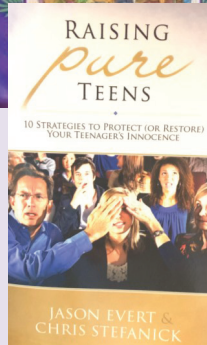

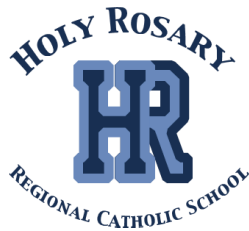

Birth Certificate, Certificate of Baptism (if your child has received additional sacraments, we must have their complete dates), Immunization Record, Letter of Subsidy payment from your pastor (if applicable), Custody Papers (if applicable), if your child has an IEP submit the Evaluation Report and most recent IEP, and, the non-refundable Registration Fee (K-8 Registration Fee – \$125/student and Pre-K4 Registration Fee - \$125/student which includes supplies and snacks for the year).

Holy Rosary Review

Holy Rosary's second floor hallway is filled with projects from Mr. Quattrochi's fifth through eighth grade social studies classes.

The fifth graders are studying the Maya, Inca, and Aztec civilizations. After selecting a civilization, the students worked in teams to create a research paper, and an accompanying Power-Point presentation, followed by the construction of a model of their civilization.



Our sixth grade is studying European countries. They were tasked with designing a travel brochure and poster which would entice readers to visit their country. The brochures highlighted the prime spots of their countries, while including important facts.

The seventh grade curriculum delves into the study of American History beginning with the development of the original 13 colonies. The students are studying how each state was formed, why it was formed, and who was the founder. Working in groups they created PowerPoint presentations that highlighted the many features of each colony, and then presented their findings to their classmates.

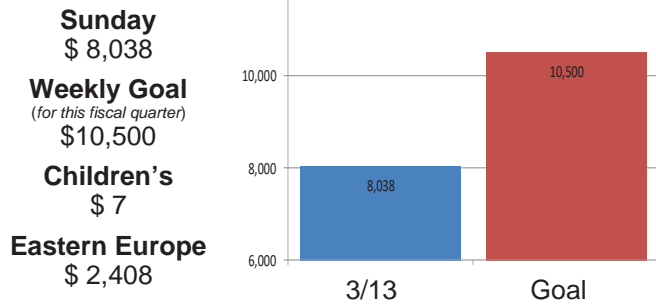
American History continues into the eighth grade. The present topic is Civil Rights. Teams were formed with the task to choose and then research a Civil Rights activist. Additionally, teams created a PowerPoint presentation and poster highlighting the achievements of their selected activist.
