From Father:

With the First Sunday of Advent, we welcome not only a new liturgical year but also an invitation to a renewed commitment to our faith in Christ, the Lord. Advent marks a powerful and grace-filled season, rich with prayer and penance, designed to awaken our hearts and prepare us to embrace the mystery of God's love made flesh. This is not simply the beginning of a new period; it is a time to rekindle our readiness to receive the One who comes for us.

The liturgy of Advent calls us to vigilance. It reminds us:

"Awaken! Remember that God comes! Not yesterday, not tomorrow, but today, now! The God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob is not distant or unconcerned but is the God-who-comes."

This season of waiting challenges us to prepare ourselves not only to celebrate the historical event of Christ's birth but to allow its transformative light to penetrate our lives. As the true light entered the world through the immaculate womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary, it continues to shine into the darkness of our own lives, illuminating and redeeming us. That light, in turn, calls us to reflect it, bringing hope and love to the world.

Advent is a season of joy and responsibility, as Saint John Henry Newman so beautifully expressed:

"Advent is a time of waiting, a time of joy because the coming of Christ is not only a gift of grace and salvation but also a time of commitment, motivating us to live the present as a time of responsibility and vigilance."

This vigilance demands an active, intentional waiting, as echoed in Saint Paul's exhortation to the Romans in today's readings:

"Besides this, you know what hour it is, how it is full time now for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed" (Rom 13:11).

Let this Advent be a time for each of us to begin the journey anew. We are called to ascend the mountain of the Lord, to be illumined by His Word, and to allow Him to guide our steps (cf. Is 2:1-5). This ascent requires that we cast aside the works of darkness and put on the "armor of light," seeking only what is pleasing to God (cf. Rom 13:12-14).

In the Gospel, Jesus reminds us that we do not know the hour of His coming. Therefore, our lives must not be marked by distraction or indifference but by vigilance and attention to even the smallest signs of His presence (cf. Mt 24:39-44).

Advent is a season to wake up, to recognize the Lord who comes to meet us now, and to reflect His light in the way we live and love. May this time of waiting inspire us to deepen our faith and renew our hope, as we prepare to welcome Christ anew into our hearts, our homes, and our world.

The Catholic Church's Advent season in 2024 will begin on **Sunday, December 1** and ends on **Tuesday, December 24**.



Advent is a time of preparation for Christmas and the second coming of Christ.

It marks the beginning of the Catholic Church's liturgical year.

The word "Advent" comes from the Latin phrase ad-venire, which means "to come to".

Begin your Advent journey by blessing your Advent wreath. Light the first violet candle and sing "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."

What can you do this Advent to prepare your heart and life for the coming of Christ?

We can have **hope** because God is faithful and will keep the promises He made to us. Our **hope** comes from God.

Romans 15:12-13

Make plans to receive the gift of God's mercy in the *Sacrament of Penance* during this Advent season.

The kind of **hope** we celebrate in Advent is about the arrival of Jesus into the world and how he can arrive into anything in our life as well. It's waiting for the plans of GOD to go down through Him.

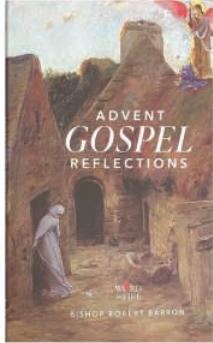
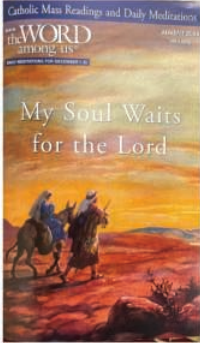


The Immaculate Conception

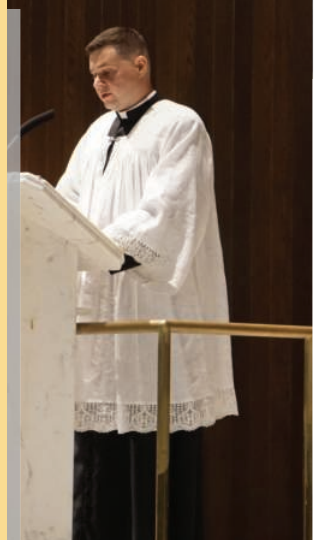

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is by request. Please notify the Parish Office as soon as possible when any parishioner becomes seriously ill or is admitted to the hospital.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month.

Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

Matrimony

Notify the Parish Office of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana sessions.
