Church Decorating for Easter

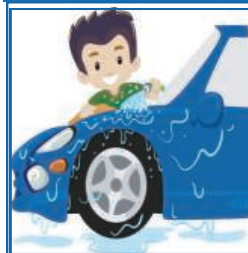
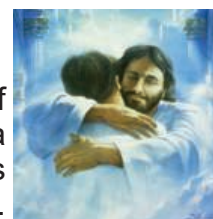

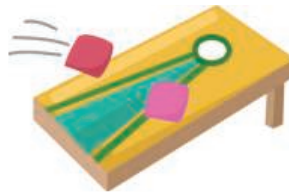

- 1 THE PALMS** are a sign of acclamation.
- 2 THE COMMEMORATION** of Jesus' entrance to Jerusalem begins Holy Week.
- 3 IT REPRESENTS** the proclamation and recognition of Jesus as the only Son of God.
- 4 DON'T THROW AWAY** your palms, keep them so that they are burned as ashes for the following year.

Jesus' triumphal entry of into Jerusalem

HOLY MONDAY

Mary anoints Jesus with perfume. Judas is scandalized and leaves.

HOLY TUESDAY

Jesus predicts Judas' betrayal and Peter's triple denial.

WHY HOLY WEEK?

We commemorate God's Immense Love for us through His Passion, Death and Resurrection.

HOLY WEDNESDAY

Judas betrays Jesus and hands him over to the chief priests.

HOLY THURSDAY

Jesus gives the New Commandment of love and institutes the Sacraments of the Holy Eucharist and of Orders during the Last Supper.

GOOD FRIDAY

the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ

DAY OF FASTING

-1 whole meal and 2 very light meals

BLACK SATURDAY

Contemplation of Jesus in the tomb in silence and adoration
-Catholics striving for Holiness-

EASTER SUNDAY

Jesus triumphs over death, sin and evil with His Resurrection, proving He is God.



Divine Mercy Sunday The First Sunday After Easter

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

Reconciliation (also known as confession or Penance) is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ in His love and mercy to offer sinners forgiveness for offenses committed against God. At the same time, sinners reconcile with the Church, because it is also wounded by our sins.

Rite of Reconciliation

Priest gives a blessing or greeting.

Make the Sign of the Cross and say, "*Bless me, father, for I have sinned My last confession was [give weeks, months, or years],*"

Confess all of your sins to the priest. (If you are unsure or uneasy, tell him and ask for help) Say, "*I am sorry for these and all of my sins.*"

The priest assigns a Penance and offers advice to help you be a better Catholic.

Say an Act of Contrition, expressing your sorrow for your sins. The priest, acting in the person of Christ, then absolves you from your sins.

Act of Contrition

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all my sins because of your just punishments; but most of all because they offend you, my God, who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of your grace to sin no more and avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen.

Every time we sin, we hurt ourselves, other people, and God. In Reconciliation, we acknowledge our sins before God and his Church. We express our sorrow in a meaningful way, receive the forgiveness of Christ and his Church, make reparation for what we have done, and resolve to do better in the future.

To make a good confession we review our lives since our last confession, searching our thoughts, words, and actions for that which did not conform to God's command to love him and one another through his laws and the laws of his Church. This is called an examination of conscience.

To make an examination of conscience:

- *Recall your sins*
- *Prayerfully ask yourself what you have done with full knowledge and full consent against God's will and the Church's commandments.*
- *See next page for examination of conscience.*

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

1. I AM THE LORD YOUR GOD. YOU SHALL NOT HAVE STRANGE GODS BEFORE ME.

Do I give God time every day in prayer?
Do I seek to love Him with my whole heart?
Have I been involved in witchcraft, superstition or black magic?
Have I received Communion in a state of mortal sin?
Have I deliberately told a lie in Confession or withheld a mortal sin in Confession?

2. YOU SHALL NOT TAKE THE NAME OF THE LORD YOUR GOD IN VAIN.

Did I curse or swear? Did I use God's name in vain, lightly, carelessly, by blasphemy?
Have I wished evil upon another person?
Have I been angry with God and stayed in that state of anger?
Have I insulted a sacred person or abused a sacred object?

3. REMEMBER TO KEEP HOLY THE LORD'S DAY.

Have I deliberately missed Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of obligation?
Have I tried to observe Sunday as a family day and a day of rest?
Do I get enough rest or am I constantly running?
Do I do needless work on Sunday?

4. HONOR YOUR FATHER AND YOUR MOTHER.

Do I honor and obey my parents? Am I disrespectful towards them?
Have I neglected my duties to my spouse and children?
Have I given my family good religious example and try to bring peace into the home?
Do I care for my aged and infirmed relatives?

5. YOU SHALL NOT KILL.

Have I had an abortion or encouraged anyone to have an abortion?
Have I mutilated myself through any form of sterilization, etc.?
Have I harbored anger or resentment or hatred in my heart?
Have I physically harmed anyone? Have I driven recklessly (too fast, showing off, etc.)?
Have I abused alcohol or drugs?
Have I hurt myself through cutting, scratching, or in any other way?

6. YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY.

Have I been faithful to my marriage vows in thought and action?
Have I engaged in any sexual activity outside of marriage (intercourse, oral sex, inappropriate touching, mutual masturbation)?
Has each sexual act in my marriage been open to the transmission of new life?
Have I been guilty of masturbation? Have I entertained lustful thoughts?
Have I been guilty of any homosexual activity?
Do I seek to be chaste in my thoughts, words, and actions?
Was I "immodest" in the way I dressed, acted or spoke (leading others to arousal)?
Are my words, texts and photos on Facebook and/or other social media sites sexually charged?
Did I look at pornography or visit chat rooms that were inappropriate?

7. YOU SHALL NOT STEAL.

Have I stolen what is not mine?
Have I returned or made restitution for what I have stolen?
Did I waste time at work (which is really stealing from the company)?
Do I gamble excessively, thereby denying my family of their needs?
Do I seek to share what I have with the poor?

8. YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOR.

Have I lied? Have I gossiped? Have I spoken behind someone else's back?
Do I always tell the truth? Did I reveal secrets that should have been kept confidential?
Am I sincere in my dealings with others?
Am I critical, negative, or uncharitable in my thoughts of others?
Is what I write in my emails, IMs, text messages or on any social media sites true about myself or others?

9. YOU SHALL NOT DESIRE YOUR NEIGHBOR'S WIFE.

Have I caused impure thoughts by impure reading, movies, conversations or curiosity?
Do I pray at once to banish impure thoughts and temptations?

10. YOU SHALL NOT DESIRE YOUR NEIGHBOR'S GOODS.

Am I jealous of what other people have?
Do I envy the families or possessions of others?
Am I greedy or selfish?
Are material possessions the purpose of my life?



From Father:

As we continue our journey through the sacred season of Lent, a time of reflection, penance, and preparation for Easter, we are called to draw nearer to God through the sacrament of Reconciliation. It is a blessed opportunity to experience the infinite mercy of our Lord and to renew our hearts in His love.

This Lent, we are pleased to announce that our parish will offer a special evening of Confessions on **Tuesday, March 26th, from 7 pm to 8 pm.** To support our community in this sacramental experience, we will have four guest confessors joining us. Their presence is a gift, allowing us to encounter Christ's forgiveness and grace through the ministry of reconciliation.

Confession is not merely about listing our sins but is a profound encounter with God's unfathomable mercy. It is about naming our sins before the Lord, not to dwell in shame, but to acknowledge our need for God's grace to overcome sin and to grow in our discipleship. In this beautiful sacrament, we are reminded of God's promise to be with us always, offering us forgiveness and the strength to turn away from sin and to live more fully in His light.

To aid in your preparation for this sacrament, the bulletin includes an Examination of Conscience. This tool is designed to help you prayerfully reflect on your life, considering ways you have or have not lived in accordance with God's commandments and the teachings of Christ. It is an invitation to introspection and honesty with oneself and God, leading to authentic conversion of the heart.

Let us embrace this chance to confess our sins, to receive God's pardon and peace, and to deepen our relationship with Him. May this Lenten confession be a step toward greater love and fidelity in our discipleship, as we prepare to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord at Easter.

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month.

Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.
