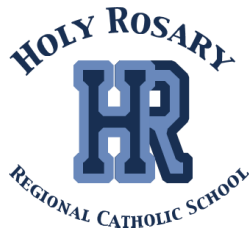

We Need Your Input!

In October of 2021, Pope Francis launched a worldwide Synod of Bishops on Synodality. That same month, Archbishop Perez launched our archdiocesan phase.

The synodal process gives us the opportunity to be heard as the Church addresses the following questions: (1) How are we journeying together? and (2) How is the Holy Spirit speaking to us? Answering these two questions will allow bishops to better understand the nature of the Church and the needs of its people.

In-person listening sessions will take place locally on Sunday, Mar. 20, 5-7 p.m., at Mother of Divine Providence Parish, King of Prussia; Sunday, Apr. 3, 5-7 p.m., at Mary, Mother of the Redeemer Parish, North Wales; and, in Spanish on Sunday, Apr. 3, 5-7 p.m., at St. Patrick Parish, Norristown. In conjunction with this effort, the Catholic Leadership Institute (CLI) initiative, *Called For More*, has created a survey which will serve as a vital tool for feedback. *The Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Survey* allows parishioners to reflect on their own spiritual growth and discipleship, and identify the ways in which the parish effectively supports that growth.

UPDATE ON THE CELEBRATION OF THE SACRED LITURGY
OFFICE FOR DIVINE WORSHIP
ARCHDIOCESE OF PHILADELPHIA
FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 25, 2022



The celebration of the Sacred Liturgy—the praise and worship of God by his people—is the greatest work of the Church carried out in all the parishes and institutions throughout the Archdiocese. With a genuine regard for the Mystery of Faith, it is also imperative that we continue to observe reasonable personal and corporate measures to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and its variants.

- Everyone is reminded of the irreplaceable need to be in-person for the celebration of Sunday Mass. At this point, it is no longer necessary to provide for the live streaming of all liturgical celebrations.
 - Those who are sick, have a health risk, or are a primary caregiver, are excused from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. Those who are legitimately excused should observe the Lord's Day by reading the Word of God and spending some time in prayer.
- The celebration of Holy Mass and all the Sacraments are to be carried out according to what is described in the liturgical books without exception. For Mass, however, in all circumstances:
 - The distribution of the Body of Christ is distributed as usual, whether in the hand or on the tongue, without distinctions.
 - The use of sanitizers during the distribution of Holy Communion are to be discontinued.
 - If a Communion Minister chooses to sanitize before the distribution of Holy Communion, this should take place in the pew prior to approaching the altar after the Invitation to Holy Communion. The priest or deacon may do so as well at the side (credence) table and not at the altar.
 - The purification of fingers after the distribution of Holy Communion should first take place with water at the side (credence) table before using a sanitizer.
 - The Invitation and the use of the Sign of Peace continue to be suspended until further notice. Alternate signs of peace should not be arbitrarily introduced.
 - The distribution of the Precious Blood continues to be suspended until further notice.
 - Priest concelebrants and assisting deacons receive the Blood of Christ typically by intinction until further notice.
- On Ash Wednesday, the Blessing and Distribution of Ashes takes place as described in the Roman Missal. Ashes may be placed on the forehead without any concern.
- An update for the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy for Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord and the Sacred Paschal Triduum will follow as soon as possible.
- In the City of Philadelphia, the faithful are strongly encouraged to wear a face covering/mask, whether vaccinated or not, in the body of the church. There is no absolute mandate for everyone to wear a face covering in any church in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Any signs indicating this should be removed.
 - The priest, deacon, and liturgical ministers are not to wear a face covering or mask in the sanctuary.
 - If a face covering or mask is worn by the faithful, it is to be removed before the reception of the Body of Christ at the Communion of the Mass.

Holy Rosary Review

Imagine a city one hundred years into the future that does not generate waste or pollution.

Our eighth grade STEM students were challenged with this question in the 2022's Future City Competition. Future City is a science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) program. The goal of the program each year is to provide students with a real-life learning experiment that they can apply to future challenges in school, work, and life. For the past three years Holy Rosary students, under the guidance of their teacher Ms. Rae Morrow, have participated in this competition. Teams are tasked with designing and building a city according to the annual theme. The requirements of the competition also include creating a PowerPoint presentation to describe the different aspects of their city and a videotape tour of their city.

This year's assignment was to create a waste-free city that uses the principles of a circular economy. The students were familiar with pollution and conserving natural resources, but a circular economy was a new concept for them.

They named their city, New Boston. It was created entirely from recycled materials or discarded materials from previous projects. Gardens, whether rooftop or on the ground, were a standard. Different species of trees dotted the city. A large farm on the outskirts of the city supplied food for the residents. The students included a river so that fish could be another food source as well as an additional manner for the transportation of people and goods. Solar panels, wind turbines, and a dam that produced hydroelectric power were part of the renewable energy sources they included. Although there were electric automobiles available, most of their citizens walked, rode bicycles, skateboarded, or traveled by boat. Additionally, no single-use items or littering was permitted in the city.

Holy Rosary students were awarded plaques and monetary awards for achieving in two separate categories: Innovative Environmental Management and Best Moving Part. Can you picture yourself in this future city?

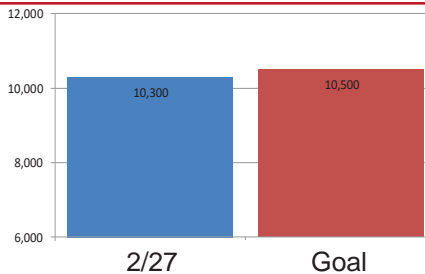
