The topic of this month's meeting is *"Take control! Combat compassion fatigue and stress."*

From Father:

As we continue to celebrate the National Eucharistic Revival, this year's Forty Hours Devotion at Epiphany of Our Lord takes on a special significance. Rooted in a tradition that stretches back centuries, the Forty Hours Devotion invites us to enter into a time of deep prayer and reflection in the presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

The devotion began in Milan, Italy, honoring the forty hours during which Christ's Sacred Body lay in the tomb. This practice soon spread to Rome through the influence of Saint Philip Neri and was eventually celebrated across Europe, largely thanks to the dedication of Saint Ignatius Loyola and the Society of Jesus. In Philadelphia, Saint John Neumann, the fourth Bishop of Philadelphia and a beloved Redemptorist, introduced the devotion on a diocesan level in 1853. Saint Alphonsus Liguori, the founder of Neumann's order, described adoration of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament as "the greatest devotion after the sacraments, the one dearest to God and the one most helpful to us."

Though Neumann faced significant opposition due to anti-Catholic sentiment and unrest in the 19th century, he persevered, receiving a reassuring vision of God's grace and protection. This vision affirmed his mission, strengthening his resolve to bring the Forty Hours Devotion to life for Catholics in Philadelphia.

Today, as we continue this tradition, we are invited to spend time in Adoration, reflecting on Christ's sacrifice and growing closer to Him. The Forty Hours Devotion is a powerful reminder of God's enduring presence and a call to deepen our relationship with Him.

This year, we are honored to welcome Rev. Matthew Brody, Pastor of St. Richard of Chichester Parish, as our guest homilist for our Annual Parish Mission. Each evening at 7:00 pm, we will gather for Vespers and Benediction, during which Father Brody will lead us in reflection on the Year of Jubilee 2025 and our journey as "Pilgrims of Hope." This time of prayer and adoration is an opportunity to find solace, inspiration, and a renewed sense of purpose in our faith.

*Please join us from **November 10-12**, as we come together as a parish family to honor Christ's presence among us. May this time of devotion lead us all to a deeper experience of His love and grace.*
