From Father:

In this Sunday's Gospel, we encounter a profound and challenging moment in Jesus' ministry. Returning to His native place, accompanied by His disciples, Jesus teaches in the synagogue on the Sabbath. The reaction of His fellow townspeople is one of astonishment and skepticism. They are familiar with Him; they know Him as the carpenter, the son of Mary, and the brother of James, Joses, Judas, and Simon. Their familiarity breeds contempt, and they take offense at Him.

This passage highlights a critical lesson about the nature of faith and the obstacles that can hinder it. Jesus' statement, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house," speaks to the difficulty of recognizing the extraordinary in the ordinary. The people of Nazareth struggled to see beyond their preconceived notions of Jesus. Their lack of faith limited the mighty deeds He could perform among them.

Reflecting on this Gospel, we are reminded of the importance of openness and humility in our faith journey. It is often easy to overlook the presence of God in the familiar aspects of our lives. We may take for granted the grace that surrounds us in our families, our parish, and our daily routines. The challenge is to cultivate a spirit of wonder and receptivity, recognizing that God's wisdom and power can manifest in the ordinary and the familiar.

As we gather as a community this Sunday, let us ask for the grace to overcome any obstacles of familiarity and skepticism that may hinder our faith. May we be open to the surprising ways God wishes to work in our lives, through the people and circumstances we know well. Let us not be amazed at a lack of faith, but rather be astonished by the depth of faith that can grow in the fertile soil of humility and openness.

May the example of Jesus inspire us to seek and honor the presence of God in every aspect of our lives, and may our faith be a source of mighty deeds and blessings for our community.

Anointing of the sick is by request. Please notify the Parish Office as soon as possible when any parishioner becomes seriously ill or is admitted to the hospital.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month.

Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.
